

Policy Type: Executive Limitations

School Safety

The Superintendent shall not cause or allow any condition in the district that is or has a reasonable potential of being unsafe.

Accordingly the Superintendent may not fail to develop a safe schools plan, following consultation with school and school district accountability committees, parents, teachers, administrators, students and when appropriate, members of the community, that provides for a safe learning environment conducive to the learning process and free from unnecessary disruption that includes:

1. Safe school reporting requirements.
2. Staff security and safety.
3. Crisis management.
4. Procedures that address the safety and security concerns of the district.
5. Procedures that address the sharing of information with other agencies, in accordance with applicable state and federal law.
6. Procedures that address persons visiting school buildings and attending school-sponsored activities.
7. Procedures that address the screening of employees subsequent to employment for criminal offenses.

In addition, the Superintendent shall not fail to develop and adopt, consistent with the *Executive Limitation* policy on Development of Administration Policy, all policies required as part of the safe schools plan.
